SERMON TEXT- Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

¹⁵ As the people were filled with expectation, & all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶ John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit & fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor & to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." ²¹ Now when all the people were baptized, & when Jesus also had been baptized & was praying, the heaven was opened, ²² and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. & a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."
