SERMON TEXT- 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

¹Now I would remind you, brothers & sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, ² through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain. ³ For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, ⁴ and that he was buried, & that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers & sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. ⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. ⁹ For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰ But by the grace of God I am what I am, & his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. ¹¹ Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim & so you have come to believe.

LISTENING TO ...

GOD- Christian life is rooted in the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit

- 1. How did Jesus appear to St. Paul (v8) if he wasn't one of the original disciples (vv5-7)? See Acts 7:54--8:1, 9:1-22
- 2. Scholars view the following passages as proto-creeds. How does the formulaic language already in use in Apostolic times show that Creeds are a natural "symbol" of Christianity, not something imposed by later power players? See Matthew 28:19; Romans 1:3-4, 10:9-13; 1 Corinthians 12:3, 15:3-7; Philippians 2:6-11 (esp. v11); 1 Timothy 1:15, 2:5, 3:1, 3:16, 4:8-9; 2 Timothy 2:11-13; Titus 3:4-8

EACH OTHER- Sharing & growing with our brothers & sisters in Christ

- 3. Review the explanation second article of the Creed in both the <u>Small & Large Catechisms</u>. A lot of meaning is packed into a few words. What stands out or surprises you in the explanations? *Available* <u>bookofconcord.org</u>
- 4. Tell of two or three times you encountered God's holiness (like Isaiah or St. Peter in the gospel reading) & acutely realized your own sinfulness (*Luke 5:8*)? What was the resolution to the event (*Luke 5:11*)?

NEIGHBORS- Bearing fruit for those not yet our brothers & sisters

- 5. Read *v11* carefully (*cf. Philippians 1:15*). Paul is less worried about the pedigree of the speaker than the pedigree of the message (*vv3-5*). How does this encourage you in your own conversations with pre-Christians friends?
- 6. In the Gospel lesson, Jesus tells the fishermen- in their failure! (*Luke 5:5*)- that they will become fishers of men (or people, if you prefer; *5:10*). This is net fishing, not rod & reel or line fishing. Think of the differences between the two. What insight does net fishing give you in your efforts to introduce your friends to your friend Jesus? *See Matthew 13:47-50*
